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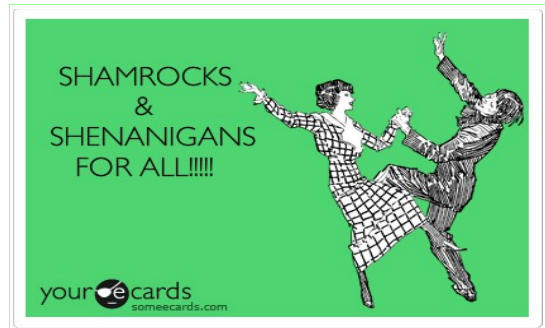
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From the Editors

If you don't have an email address, you can receive a printed copy of the newsletter as well as any other documents as they change.

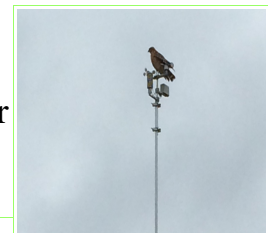
